Brief Explanations: Near the end of 2023 Project Hope purchased its first ultrasound for the clinic for ~\$45,000, represented under program services for the medical clinic.


For 2024, a change in quarterly disbursement means end of year funding has already been reflected in this statement, thus expenses appear higher compared to previous years' statements of a similar period. However, program growth related expenses and inflation has nonetheless continued an upward trend in operating expenses. Funds were also disbursed for an EKG machine this year.

CLINIC STATS

- 1,832 outpatient appointments completed January through September (203 per month).
- A 60 year old man with past history of diabetes and paralysis due to a stroke came in to the clinic quite ill. An ultrasound discovered a kidney infection (pyelonephritis) and swelling of the kidney (hydronephrosis), as well as a blood clot (deep venous thrombosis). He also had a bed sore and a foot ulcer. He desperately needed to be admitted to the hospital but couldn't afford it. The team at Project Hope developed an innovative approach of administering antibiotics by bladder irrigation. They cared for his wounds daily. Over several days he was healed!
- In January-March there was a Dengue fever outbreak in Dire Dawa. Dengue fever is caused by a virus spread by mosquitos. It causes a syndrome known as "break-bone fever" that can include hemorrhaging, severe joint pain and a rash. Incidences has been dramatically increasing in the world recently. Dire Dawa has seen a disproportionate number of outbreaks in Ethiopia and as a result has been written up in medical journals. Several Project Hope staff contracted Dengue fever. Praise God all recovered. The clinic treated dozens of patients suffering with Dengue.







EXPANDING OUR SERVICES

A New Diagnostic Service

A state-of-the-art ultrasound machine was introduced to the clinic, operated by a part-time technician who performed 25-30 scans per month. Kidney stones emerged as the most frequently diagnosed condition, while other findings included pneumonia, gallstones, and ovarian cysts. News of the ultrasound service quickly spread throughout the village, leading to a notable increase in overall clinic visits.

Pharmacy Budget Increases 400%


Our clinic provides free medicine. With the introduction of the ultra sound machine, patient visits have basically doubled. This creates more general demand for medicines and also a need for increased diversity of medicines.

New Eye Program

We partnered with Global Vision 2020. With the U-See kit, we are able to provide prescription eyeglasses in about 15 minutes at \$4.00 a pair.

Currently, the goal is to raise enough money to:

- Build an exam room dedicated to the vision program.
- Purchase an autorefractor which will enable us to quickly evaluate if the person is a good candidate for our program by diagnosing conditions such as astigmatism, cataracts, etc.
- Hire an Optometrist which the country requires.
- Enable us to purchase a wider variety of frames.
- Enable us to pay for eye exam and glasses for the people that we cannot help.

ONGOING CHILD SPONSORSHIP

We've just reached the milestone of 100 child sponsorships, reflecting the deepening relationships within our community built through years of dedicated service! Through this support, we're able to provide clothing, food, school fees, and more for these children. Thanks to our generous sponsors, we can care for the most at-risk children in meaningful ways!









Having a sponsor child through Project Hope is such a light to me and my family. Being able to travel to Ethiopia to actually meet Hamza was life-changing. YEAR HIGHLIGHTS

- Twenty Chromebooks were added to the Gendetesfa Primary Schools Digital Library.
- Twenty Chromebooks were donated to open a second computer lab at the Detachu Elementary School.
- 5 Chromebooks & 5 Dell Laptops were donated to Living Word for an outreach digital library.
- Wifi was donated for a year to both Primary Schools.
- 96 Backpacks were given to our sponsored children.
- 700lbs of primary readers, curriculum, and educational supplies were distributed between both Primary Schools.

Empowering at-risk women and their children by equipping them with microfinance loans, ongoing training, and support to build self-sustaining businesses, ensuring stability, economic growth, and increased job opportunities.



A LIFE GIVEN HOPE: Nuria

Nuria is a mother of two sons and one daughter, residing in Gendetesfa. She was given a microfinance loan of ETB 5,000 (\$90) enabling her to begin a small business in teff "combing" and goat rearing. To date, Nuria has seen her family establish a sustainable income and the family's living standards improved greatly, especially in access to education and healthcare. Nuria sends her deepest thanks to all those who give to Project Hope for making "this transformation in my family possible because of you." She and her husband ask for your constant prayers for their health.

A LIFE GIVEN HOPE: Kokobe

In the red light district of Detachu, our microfinance officer visited Kokabe and her family. "Their home was in serious trouble because the family have only very little source of income."

She was trained and given her first loan to purchase the equipment needed to start a potato and snack business.

Our officer reports, "Despite facing many challenges, the effort that she made and the hope that she has is amazing! She is already looking to expand!"

 - o 3rd Loan Amount 15,000 ETB
- Co-Operative Each loan recipient must have a sponsor who will also sign the loan agreement.

- Accounting The Loan Manager meets with each borrower monthly to review the business and collect loan repayment.
- Oversight Loan reports are completed and reviewed by external Project Hope directors.
